Rockwood has received much acclaim for its many achievements and nationally ranked Blue Ribbon Schools. In addition to numerous educational honors, the School District has earned and maintained a "Triple A" financial rating. Our private schools have grown and achieved National recognition with outstanding education and a variety of programs. Our Preschool and Kindergarten programs, both public and private, prepare children for a lifetime of learning. Our churches and organizations inspire a true core belief in community and family.

As we continue to grow, Eureka has the strong building blocks to maintain our identity and unique character. The City and many partners work diligently to ensure that growth is planned and undertaken in a manner that continues to enhance and highlight the advantages of our wonderful community.

Eureka Sweetens Up with Addition of Little Dipper Chocolate

There is no denying that Eureka is a little sweeter these days, Little Dipper Chocolate shop located in Hilltop Village Center is making sure of it.

Owner, Beth Prindable, fell in love with chocolate after working at The Chocolate Bar in LaFayette Square. "I wasn't really a chocolate lover, but once I sampled their chocolate, I thought 'where has this been all my life' and I started on the path that led me here."

Beth had always enjoyed cooking and baking. She owned her own catering company, but with the birth of her son, her priorities and time shifted and she needed a job that was less demanding. She started researching and experimenting with chocolate. Beth attended Christmas bazaars, craft shows and other festivals selling her chocolate. From there she cultivated a following that led to selling at farmers markets. "I spoke with a lot of farmer's about their crops and how they care for them. It made me more aware of the education and intention these people put into their craft and I want to do the same for my chocolate. Knowing that workers are treated fairly and that my ingredients are as good for you as possible is important to me."

Little Dipper Chocolate has an array of chocolates from dark chocolate truffles to sea salt caramel turtles with pecans to macadamia nut and tart cherry bark to an array of other amazing combinations. Beth said her creations depend on availability of ingredients as well as where her imagination and instinct take her. Opening a brick-and-mortar store is a big step, but Beth shared she was at a crossroads. Business had expanded so much that she needed a dedicated space and yet opening a store seemed like a big step. Ultimately she felt like she would always be curious if she didn't take the leap and she is so happy she did. Little Dipper is growing their business and already has plans to expand their hours in the fall. Beth shared, "I am so happy to be in Eureka. I am grateful for the positive responses and reviews we have gotten from the people here."

Beyond expanding their store hours, Little Dipper also does mail orders in the cooler months and offers chocolate catering for weddings, bridal showers and parties. They are working on expanding their menu with even more decadent treats and offering more kid friendly items and activities.


Meet Me in the Lou

Largest Fireworks Show in Midwest to be Held at Brookdale Farms

The 2015 date has been set for September 19th for the Pyromania Annual Fireworks show and will be held again at Brookdale Farms in Eureka!

The event is a cooperation between the Missouri Pyrotechnic Association and P.A.W. Stoppers who raise funds to support multiple Police K-9 units throughout the St Louis metropolitan area. Gates open at 10:00 a.m. for the car show, K-9 demonstrations, music and more. Fireworks start at dusk, plan on arriving by 4:00 p.m. for the best parking and seating. Don't forget your chairs and cameras! PLEASE NO COOLERS. On-site concessions are provided and essential to the event's success. The event has drawn spectators from 25 states and premium seating fills early so bring the family out to Brookdale Farms for an entire day and night of fun for only \$5.00 per person or \$25.00 per car load! Bring your own chairs.

Pyromania is an all day family event with a car show, food, kids activities, K-9 demonstrations and the main event; a fireworks display lasting over two hours! Actually it is a series of displays, 10 of them back to back to back including one of the ONLY pyrotechnic competitions in the United States today. St. Andrew's at Francis Place

Residents of Eureka, Missouri have been abuzz ever since St. Andrew's Resources for Seniors System, in partnership with the Ursuline Sisters, took over sponsorship of the Price Memorial retirement community and renamed it St. Andrew's at Francis Place.

A \$4.5 million renovation began in January to the facility that was built in the late 70's. Vikki Czech, Director of Admissions, shared, "The building had great bones, and the location is unmatched..full of wide sweeping views of Eureka's rolling hills...but the facility needed a major face lift. The project will be finished at the end of the year and we are confident that the changes will be stunning."

The renovations include replacing the large cafeteria-style dining room with four separate intimate dining areas, allowing for residents and families to eat in a cozy, homelike setting. Additional improvements include new carpeting, new lighting, new on-site laundry facility, wireless Internet and free in-room satellite TV featuring daily mass, a brand new rehab gym, and the installation of an electronic medical records system.

Not only is the building being renovated, but changes in resident care have been adopted. Vikki explained, "The bar has been raised for the skilled nursing industry as a whole. Our residents remember having to put their parents in nursing homes and it was not a pleasant experience. At St. Andrew's at Francis Place we focus on person centered care and want to create a household community. Ultimately our residents are our bosses. We may know how best to meet their physical needs, but they know what types of social activities and groups they want to participate in...whether it be a garden club, men's group or cooking club. It is important to us that they have a voice."

St. Andrew's at Francis Place is a five star rated facility through the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services which rates facilities based on three areas: inspections, staffing and quality measures. They have two main focuses of care; short-term Medicare rehabilitation and skilled nursing care. They are also on the list of approved community nursing homes to care for Veterans. This is a program offered in many communities so Veterans can receive care near their homes and families.

St. Andrew's at Francis Place is diligently working on becoming a larger part of the community by offering informational seminars on topics like elder care law and Alzheimer's disease as well as participating in more

community events like Eureka Days. Girl Scout Troops and area schools have recently been stopping by to visit the residents, which they absolutely love.

Dr. Frick's Pet Rehab & Pain Clinic Finds New Home in Eureka



Dr. Ava Frick has been a practicing veterinarian since 1980. Having an interest in all manners of health and nutrition, she broadened her horizons to other similar practices including rehabilitation and pain management for the animals she treats. Three years ago, she opened a clinic in Chesterfield, she also has a location in Union. Dr. Frick shared, "I originally wanted to open my second location in Eureka, but there were no available locations that worked for me at the time. My lease just came up in Chesterfield and I looked again at Eureka and I am thrilled that we found a spot." She will be opening a location in Eureka on East 5th Street just East of Central Avenue the beginning of September.

Dr. Frick is constantly working towards advances in safe and natural pain management practices for animals. Her studies in this field have brought her to produce a vast assortment of seminars, and she's written a book to improving your horse's standard of living entitled "Fitness in Motion".


Dr. Frick and her staff accept all new clients and case specific referrals from other doctors. Below is a sample of what her clinic offers:

- Rehab for animals that recently had surgery or suffer from bad backs, paresis, pain or arthritis.
- Program to successfully help obese animals lose weight. This is important for overall health benefits and to help ease pressure and strain on their joints.
- Canine Sports Medicine for active dogs such as racing, sporting or working dogs. They can help the animal maintain strength and endurance while reducing stress to the body. An at-home exercise program is also recommended.
- Complementary medicine techniques such as chiropractic and acupuncture are available. Chiropractic helps via adjustments to an animal's joints thereby improving movement, optimal range of motion and creating better vascular and neurological health. Acupuncture is the insertion of needles into specific points on the body to cause a desired healing effect. It is used mainly for functional problems such as those that involve paralysis, noninfectious inflammation (such as allergies) and pain.
- She also works with animals that have chronic health conditions such as cancer, liver disease, skin issues and allergies. For these patients, Dr. Frick determines which vitamins and minerals the animal may be lacking and puts together a nutritional program that addresses the deficiencies or toxicities. She focuses on foods that are grain and chemical free and boost antioxidants and the immune system.

This clinic does not do surgeries, vaccinations or other traditional veterinary practice procedures.

The Eureka location will have a retail area featuring a variety of foods with ingredients that are truly good for your pet. Dr. Frick will also be offering various training programs at the new location.

They will be open Monday - Saturday with two days having extended hours into the evening. Dr. Frick shared, "Everyone in Eureka has been extremely welcoming. I am looking forward to being a part of this community."





Eureka Named One of the “Best Towns to Raise a Family”

It is a legendary tale as to how the City of Eureka got its name. The laborers had toiled long and hard to bring the railroad out west from St. Louis in 1853. They had already passed through the towns of Webster Groves, Kirkwood and Valley Park. In the hot summer of 1853, you can only imagine the suffering of digging out a railroad track along the bluffs of the Meramec. As they came around the bend and looked at a long flat valley, legend says that one of the workers yelled “Eureka! I found it.” Now it seems as if the whole world has found Eureka.

The City of Eureka has recently been highly ranked by Niche.com Niche ranks neighborhoods, cities, K-12 schools and colleges across the U.S. In their 2015 “Best Towns to Raise a Family” ranking, Eureka ranked 13th nationally and first in Missouri.

Niche ranks US towns based on school ratings, crime rates, age demographics and access to affordable housing and childcare. A high ranking indicates that a town attracts young families with good schools and a safe community. Things like community involvement and access to family necessities help measure how good an area is for families. In a recent announcement by McBride & Sons Homes to build 528 homes in Eureka, the Niche ranking and quality of life were cited as reasons to bring the development here.

How did Eureka get to this point? A lot of hard work by a lot of people over the last 60 years. I recently had dinner with Eureka Mayor Kevin Coffey to discuss this.

Right now Eureka is the fastest growing community in St. Louis County. The thing Kevin is most proud of the quality of the growth. An example- the McBride & Son development will save 50% of the trees, include trails, a new school site and a variety of housing for all ages and incomes. The key is the incredible working relationship between the City, the Police Department, the Fire District and the Chamber of Commerce. Eureka’s Economic Director, Julie Wood, shares an office with the Chamber. Kevin said it would not be possible without the great City employees and a dedicated Board of Aldermen. These entities all work together well towards a common goal. All of these groups work together with the business community, which had led to successes like the resurgence of Old Town Eureka.

One of the key components of this community is its park system. I am proud of the fact that my father, Leon Kircher, was very instrumental in starting Eureka’s park system. I remember when he got the property for Eureka’s first park, Drewel Park, for \$1. Mayor Kevin Coffey has been dedicated to this. This has expanded to include a system of trails connecting several parks. Eureka Parks and Recreation offers many family-oriented activities, and The Timbers of Eureka Recreation Center has been a huge success. Kevin Coffey believes that a strong park system is needed for quality of life in a community.

The City of Eureka has been willing to make investments in the community. The FREE Movie Nights, Concerts on Central, 4th of July Fireworks and now their first Balloon Glow, all contribute to the quality of life. Eureka Days has grown to become one of the best fairs in the area, with a huge commitment by the City. This is all to make Eureka a complete community. Because of this, Eureka will continue to grow. Kevin Coffey says, “We know we’re going to grow. We want to make sure the growth benefits everyone.”

A car dealer will soon be on Fifth Street east of Central. The old Nina’s Produce will be an animal therapy center. The new McDonald’s on the corner of Central and Fifth St. will soon be finalizing plans. Ponderosa will soon open as a Bonanza. The Hilltop Village Shopping Center is under new ownership and soon to be remodeled. The number one priority of the new owner will be to lease the vacant anchor spot opposite of Dickey Bub. There is interest in the old movie theater property. This is just the short list of what’s coming.

My family moved to Eureka in 1960. Us old timers that have been here a long time found out long ago that Eureka was a good place to raise a family. I raised two daughters in this town. Now our secret is out.

Whenever I meet new people that have recently moved to Eureka, I ask them why they moved here. As they talk about the great parks, the community activities, the great churches and great schools, it always boils down to one thing-quality of life. That lone railroad laborer from over 150 years ago had no idea the prophecy he stated that day. Eureka-I found it! turns out to be true. Eureka is a great place to live.
