TRASH AND RECYCLING HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

In observance of Memorial Day, Monday, May 27th, all service days will be changed from their scheduled day to the day following. If your service is normally scheduled for Monday it will be picked up on Tuesday of that week, Tuesday's pickup will be on Wednesday, Wednesday's pickup will be on Thursday, Thursday's pickup will be on Friday, and Friday's pickup will be on Saturday.

ILLEGAL DUMPING

It is illegal to dump yard waste such as stumps, limbs, grass, leaves and bush and flower clippings into ditches or creeks as they often cause drainage problems at a later date. When rain events occur, the City has experienced major issues caused by the overabundance of such debris being washed into our storm sewers and drainage ditches causing flooding and damage to residences. It has been brought to our attention that pet waste is being dumped into the storm sewer which is also illegal. Pet waste should be bagged and disposed of with household trash. We encourage anyone who witnesses this type of activity to report such to City Hall, anonymously if you so choose, so that we may take the appropriate action against the individuals who are engaged in this activity to help prevent these situations from occurring in the future.

TRASH COLLECTION REMINDERS

As the summer months are approaching, lawn sprinklers will soon be turned on. Please be mindful of the fact that if you place your paper yard waste bags near an area that is sprinkled they may fall apart, leaving debris in your yard and the street when the trash hauler attempts to transport them to the truck. To avoid this type of situation, please place paper yard waste bags in an area not affected by the sprinkler. If you feel you have an excessive amount of bulky trash to be picked up which might require more than one person to load the items onto the truck, please call Waste Connections at 636-321-2100 so they can evaluate the situation prior to the regularly scheduled pickup and remove the articles in a timely fashion.

TRASH RECEPTACLE STORAGE

As stated in the Eureka Municipal Code, all items are to be placed at the curb between the hours of 6:00 p.m. the day prior to collection and 6:30 a.m. the day of pick up. Empty trash containers must be removed from the curb no later than 8:00 p.m. the day of collection. If your containers are stored outdoors, they must be stored in the rear or side yard, and placed or screened so as to not be visible from the street fronting the principal structure.

EXTERIOR APPEARANCE PROGRAM

As a reminder, before any property can be sold, an inspection must be performed by the Building Department to determine if there are any deteriorated conditions that need to be addressed prior to closing. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PUBLIC NOTICE

The City of Eureka will hold a public hearing to discuss the allocation of \$20,000.00 in Community Development Block Grant funds, which will become available after January 1, 2020. The public hearing will be held at 7:00 p.m. on June 4, 2019 at Eureka City Hall. To further its commitment to fair and equitable treatment of all citizens, the City of Eureka has enacted and/or enforces the following: (1) A Fair Housing Ordinance prohibiting unlawful discrimination against any person because of race, sex, color, religion, disability, familial status or national origin; (2) A Policy of Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Disability in the admission or access to, or employment in, its federally assisted programs or activities; (3) A Policy of Equal Opportunity to Participate in Municipal Programs and Services regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, familial status, national origin or political affiliation; (4) A requirement for bidding on CDBG activities that promotes employment opportunities created by HUD funding and that these opportunities be afforded to low-income community residents and businesses.
